Principal's Column

Dear Parents,

Over the next two weeks of term and Week 1 of next term, Oral Reporting will take place at school. This is a time for parents/guardians to meet their child's teacher to discuss progress, reset expectations and set a plan for Term 2. This year we are having these meetings earlier. Term 1 is a long 10 week time frame and early in Term 2 we have several short weeks which make it difficult to organise interviews.

Your child/children will have an Oral Reporting letter for you to indicate your preferred time to meet your child's class teacher. Please return as soon as possible for teachers to confirm your appointment time.

Some Parent tips for school meetings from Michael Grose's "Building Parent - School Partnerships":-

1. Check the confirmed meeting date and time
2. Work from a clean slate - Every meeting offers a fresh opportunity to create better outcomes for your child
3. Prepare well - List questions you wish to raise. Keep questions short and to the point. Take notes, so important information isn't missed
4. Listen first - Give the teacher a chance to make an assessment of your child's progress or behaviour
5. Ask specific questions - Clarify the information you don't understand, asking for examples
6. Stay solution focused - If your child's behavioural or learning challenges are discussed it is tempting to be defensive
7. Remain calm - Meetings involving your children can be emotive as you are discussing issues that are outside your direct control
8. Ask what you can do - Working together for the betterment of your child's learning
9. Discuss at home - Discuss areas that need work in positive specific terms

Involve your children in discussing plans for improvement and praise your child for the great work they are doing at school.

Parent/Teacher meetings will be more effective if you go in with a positive attitude, an approachable demeanour and a willingness to work collaboratively with your child's teacher to reach the best outcomes possible for your child.

This Friday is St Patrick's Day and as has become tradition at Good Counsel Primary School, a gold coin donation will be collected by class teachers from students who wear their green clothes. Money raised will go to Project Compassion.
