Late yesterday all families will have received an email with a linking SMS from Catholic Education Services regarding COVID-19 (Coronavirus).

The coronavirus (COVID-19), is continuing to be a growing concern for health authorities worldwide and we are seeing examples in a number of countries of its health, social and economic impacts. Catholic Education in Cairns is actively planning to manage the impact of this virus in our schools and our wider school communities if and when this occurs. While we hope to be spared the worst aspects of this health emergency, we must prepared for nevertheless be the challenges ahead.

In addition to the advice of our State and Commonwealth health authorities we would like to advise the measures we will implement for Cairns Catholic schools as part of our duty of care and commitment to the safety of all members of our school * communities.

Over the coming weeks we will be heavily promoting hygienic practices at all schools. Did you know what determines the day Lent begins?

he beginning of Lent depends on the date of Easter.

aster follows a lunar, rather than a solar, calendar and is celebrated on ne Sunday that follows the first full moon after March 21, the vernal spring) equinox. Therefore Easter cannot fall earlier than March 22 or later nan April 25.

Il the other moveable celebrations in the Church calendar ultimately epend on the date of Easter.

Nost of the Eastern Churches follow the same basic principles but often elebrate Easter on a date different from Catholics and other Western Christians because they continue to follow the calendar of Julius Caesar ithout the corrections incorporated by Pope Gregory XIII in 1582.

ulius Caesar's calendar calculated the year as 365 days and 6 hours and nus was about 11 minutes and 9 seconds more than the sun's actual ourse. Although tiny, this excess puts the calendar off by a day, more or ess, every 128 years. Thus, the Council of Nicaea already found it ecessary to regress the date of the spring equinox to March 21 instead of ne original date of March 25.

by the time of Pope Gregory XIII the difference had grown so much that the pring equinox occurred on March 11.

1581 with the bull "Inter Gravissimas" Pope Gregory promulgated a widepread reform which, among other things, re-established the spring equinox n March 21 by eliminating 10 days from October 1582. Coincidence would ave it that St. Teresa of Avila died on that very night of Oct. 4-15.

he error of Julius Caesar's calendar was corrected by deciding that the urn of the century—always a leap year in the Julian calendar—would be so nly when the year could be divided by 400, that is 1600, 2000 2400 2800, tc., whereas there would be no leap year in the others.

Nost Catholic countries, and even some Protestant ones, accepted the eform almost immediately. Some countries, such as England, held off ccepting the papal reform until 1752 while Russia did not adopt it until afer the Communist takeover in 1918.

he calculation is still not perfect as there is still a difference of 24 seconds etween the legal and the solar calendar. However, 3,500 years will have pass before another day is added.

Setting back to Lent. This season comprises 40 days before Easter without ounting Sundays which, even though they are called "Sundays of Lent," re not days of penance. Church tradition has always excluded fasting and enance on a Sunday.

he tradition of a fast in preparation for Easter goes back to the late third entury but it varied in duration. The tradition of a 40-day fast was stablished in Rome between 354 and 384, although it began after the first unday.

s this period was also deemed suitable for the final preparation of andidates for baptism, the baptismal scrutinies were incorporated with the tes of this season. Scrutinies are communal prayers celebrated around ne elect to strengthen them to overcome the power of sin in their lives and arow in virtue.

ater, at the start of the sixth century, the beginning of Lent was moved up Ash Wednesday in order to guarantee 40 days of effective fasting.
