

Dear Parents/Carers,

We have received some directives related to Coronavirus (Covid 19) from Catholic Education Services Cairns this morning in relation to future school operations, events and activities. This will give us clear direction in relation to activities and events for the coming weeks. This advice is based on information and direction from State and Commonwealth Heath authorities and our overall concern for our school communities.

Thank you again for your understanding as we continue to work together to respond to COVID 19. As always, the health and well-being of our students and staff remain our top priority.

The Government has announced major new measures to respond to COVID 19. They are: -

- Non-essential static gatherings of more than 500 people can no longer occur
- Every person who arrives in Australia from any country from 12:00am 16
 March must complete 14 days of self-isolation

The government has also repeated its advice that schools remain open for students and staff.

While schools are open, there will be some very important changes. These are being made to maximise the health and safety of students, parents and staff. They are as follows:

- All members of the school community including staff presenting with cold or flu like symptoms will be asked to stay at home
- All school excursions will be cancelled until further notice
- All major arts and sports activities and events will temporarily cease. This
 includes whole school sporting events and inter-school events
- Lunch breaks will be monitored in regard to seating arrangement
- Schools will avoid large gatherings such as assemblies, masses, liturgies, cultural activities and carnivals and other non-essential school activities

For our school this will mean the cancellation or postponement of the following:

- Weekly Assemblies Monday/Friday
- Development Cup 20 March
- P&F Meet & Greet/Student Council Fluoro Disco 20 March
- Holy Week Prayer assemblies

Whole School Cross Country event – 1 April

CES has approved an additional **Pupil Free Day** to be taken on the final day of this term 4 April. Schools will use this Student Free Day for planning for *continuity of learning*. As a system, we are investigating options for online/remote schooling should students or staff be required to self-isolate for a period of 14 days or possible school closures.

More advice will be released on how we will provide limited supervision on the planned Pupil Free Day for small numbers of students whose parents cannot make alternative arrangements, particularly those whose parents or carers work in the education or health industry.

For now, school life will continue with an emphasis on improved hygiene, additional cleaning of high use areas and we will continue to communicate the facts to our community when any situation changes. The best advice from QLD Health is to protect yourself and others from infection by practising good hand and respiratory hygiene including:

- Cleaning hands with soap and water
- Covering your nose and mouth with a tissue or flexed elbow when coughing or sneezing
- Avoiding contact with anyone who has flu-like symptoms
