Furthermore, *María del Rosario* is a common female Spanish name (colloquially abbreviated to *Rosario* or *Charo*). *Rosario* can also be used as a male first name, particularly in Italian. The cathedral for the Diocese of Toledo in Toledo, Ohio is named after Our Lady Of the Rosary.

#### October-Mission Month...

GCPS, along with your generous support of Children's Mission month, will hold the Gold Coin Mission Day on Friday 9 October. All students and staff are asked to wear their most colourful, amazing socks on the day.
