Dear Parents/Carers,

Yesterday, 24 May on the Feast Day of 'Our Lady Help of Christians' (Patron Saint of Australia), we celebrated across Australia 200 years of Catholic Education. Marking this significant milestone is both an acknowledgement of our history and an aspirational view to our future.

In October 1820, Irish Priest, Fr John Therry put his 'Faith in the Future' when he founded the first Catholic School in Australia. That school founded by a former convict George Marley, was in Hunter Street Parramatta and had 31 students. Since the first school in Paramatta, Catholic Schools have educated millions of children in Australia. Today, 1 in 5 students attend Catholic Schools which represent 768 000 students in 1751 schools across the country with 40% located in regional, rural and remote communities. Over 98 000 teachers and staff educate these students daily.

In our own school setting here at Good Counsel, our history tracks back to 1903 when three Sisters of the Good Samaritan Order sailed into Innisfail or Geraldton as it Congratulations to our GCPS students was known then, to open the Sacred Heart (Convent) School here on Rankin Street.

Yesterday, our Student Council was invited to St Monica's Cathedral in Cairns to celebrate Mass with Bishop James and representatives from our 29 schools in the Cairns Diocese. At the same time around



Australia, 200 years of Catholic Education was being recognised by all 33 Australian Dioceses. All 178 000 students will receive a Prayer Card today in class as a memento of the significant milestone in Catholic Education.

In conclusion, let us take stock of words penned by Pope Francis in his recent encyclical - Fratelli tutti 'schooling is the right of all children and that a good education can make an enormous difference in the lives of young people, setting them up for life (SS 109 & 130).

We (parents and staff) at Good Counsel Primary are entrusted with the responsibility of shaping our students so they too like the millions before them can have Faith in their Future as Fr Rob Galea sings 'live, love, reach out to the world bringing joy, hope and peace in God's name, as your people, we have Faith, Faith in the Future'.
