# School Transport Assistance



## Dear Parents/ Carers

There were changes to isolation rules that took effect from 6 pm last Thursday night (28 May). These changes relate to Close Contacts. The definition of a close contact has not changed. You are a close contact if you have been with a person (who has Covid-19) for more than 4 hours in a house or other accommodation, a care facility or similar.

Change 1 - (This took effect just prior to the commencement of the term) If a person, adult, or student, has had COVID 19, they will not be considered a close contact for 12 weeks after they finished their isolation. While they are required to wear a mask for 7 days after their isolation, they are not required to wear a mask for the remaining 11 weeks.

Change 2 - (this took effect last Thursday night at 6:00pm)

If a person, adult, or child, is considered a close contact by the existing definition, because a family member or someone they reside with has contracted COVID, please note the following:

- They are still regarded as a close contact but.
- They no longer have to isolate if they do not have any symptoms, however.
- For adults and students 12 years old or older, if they are a close contact then they must wear a mask while indoors or on public transport. (Not required for a dedicated school bus services for students.)
- · All close contacts regardless of age must perform a RAT or PCR test when they become aware they are a close contact and perform a RAT or PCR on days 2, 4 and 6.
- · It is important to remember that if any of these tests are positive, then it should be assumed that the close contact has

tested.

The normal mask wearing rules apply for close contacts and these have not changed:

- seated.
- physical distancing.
- times.

Mask wearing for close contacts is only for 7 days after they become aware that they are a close contact. Queensland Health still recommends that everyone should wear a mask if they are unable to maintain physical distancing.

As a parent or carer, if you become aware your child is a close contact, then you are required by Qld Health to notify the school, but your children can still attend as long as they follow the information above and continue to have no symptoms.

There are two major reasons for these changes. The first is that the vaccination rate in Queensland is now high enough so that close contacts, who do not have

COVID, and they are required to follow the normal isolation rules.

If adults or students develop symptoms, then they should immediately isolate, assume they have COVID and get

· Masks must be worn while indoors, while standing or presenting and when a student is unable to maintain physical distancing.

• Mask do not have to be worn while Queensland Health still recommends that mask should be worn by all, even for close contacts who are under 12.

 Masks do not have to be worn by close contacts outside unless the person is unable to maintain

If there is a medical reason not to wear a mask, then the person needs to maintain physical distancing at all

any symptoms, do not have to isolate so as to control the spread of COVID.

The second reason is that these changes will allow more students to return to school. Mandates regarding vaccination of staff and those adults who provide a service to the school, have not changed.

Please read this as we have had some reason for concern with the safety of students at drop off and pick up times. Please also note that the Rankin St Drop Off/ Pick up Zone has now been painted with yellow paint and cars are not to be parked and drivers leave their vehicle during the indicated times. Once again thankyou to all who do the right thing regards to student safety.
