With a sense of the First Nations country upon which Good Counsel Primary is situated, where learning and ceremony have taken place over many thousands of years, we acknowledge the Mamu People and pay our respects to all Elders – past, present and emerging.

Dear Parents/ Carers

This week concludes the end of a very busy term of teaching, learning, assessing, sporting and cultural activities mixed in with lots of outside excursions, camps and sickness. Teachers and students are certainly ready for a well-earned break. Hopefully families get an opportunity to spend some quality time together camping, completing a project or travelling.

Over the past few weeks we have had cause to speak to students about what is appropriate to post or send from a device from home. In most cases the platform used is Messenger Kids which is legal for students under 12 once an adult has authenticated it with their own account.

As parents we teach our children to speak politely and clearly when communicating in person. The same advice applies to social media. Our conversations and lessons will prepare them to be appropriate when you are not present.

A couple of social media points that may assist in the social media space. Top 8 Device Tips for Kids and possibly adults.

- 1) Know and monitor your child's device.
- 2) Store the device in a family space (kitchen) to be charged at night.
- Children should not have access to the device after bed time.
- Limit the number of hours of access to devices.
- Is it worth posting? Is it accurate? Is it appropriate?
- Think before you type.
- 7) Do you want your principal to see this?
- 8) Don't be pressured by the child– You are the adult!

Social media is just like any social space and requires children to behave ethically and with kindness. When they overstep and post hurtful things then they need to apologise and fix their mistakes. This will make for a happier household, school and community. As always if you have any concerns about your children the social media space seek assistance.
