Dear Parents/ Carers

Last week seemed like a blur as I was away attending Teacher Professional Development as well as spending a day and night at Year 5 camp. The PD was presented by Dr Lyn Sharratt a Canadian Educator, Author and Consultant who has been working with our Cairns Diocesan schools for the past 4 years. Her work is based around the basics of what matters most in learning, teaching and leading. Her input on Wednesday asked us to focus on classroom practice - how and what we teach and then on Friday, 11 schools showcased how they have improved their classroom teaching to improve their data. This information will be used to continue to improve our teaching here at Good Counsel Primary School, sharing the insights with our staff to ultimately increase student engagement and learning.

On Thursday, I was able to join our Year 5 campers who attended the Tinaroo Environmental Education Centre. They had three days of activities, challenging oneself and working on their team building skills. Activities included team challenges, Rogaining, the vertical challenge, giant swing (my least favourite), canoeing, scoop netting and swimming. Our Lady of the Rosary...

Friday's Mini Vinnies Prayer Assembly will focus on the Rosary.

Praying the Rosary can be an opportunity to slow down, be quiet and focus on God. It helps us to become comfortable with intercessions to Mary, as in such times that we are praying to ask God for something very important, especially for our loved ones who are unwell.

Praying the Rosary is meant to be a meditation upon the life of Christ and Mary in the Scriptures. Although not every mystery can be found specifically in the Bible, it is an effective way to explore the stories from the Bible.

The Rosary is a series of beads on a chain. As we say the Rosary, our fingers move from bead to bead.

The prayers we recite when we pray the rosary are:

The Apostles' Creed, The Our Father, The Glory Be, The Hail Mary and The Hail Holy Queen. Each decade of the Rosary asks us to pray 10 Hail Marys.

The Rosary has four mysteries.

These mysteries are about the life of Jesus and Mary.

The names of these mysteries are:

The Joyful Mysteries - events of joy, happiness
The Luminous Mysteries - events of light, revelation
The Sorrowful Mysteries - events of sadness, suffering, sorrow
The Glorious Mysteries - events of glory, triumph, victory

Often the children will tell me that they pray the Rosary with their nanna or nonna. Please join with us on Friday morning as we pray a small part of the Rosary together.
