Organisation: They are organised. They keep track of their assignments and due dates. They have a system for taking notes and keeping them organised. They also know where to find the resources they need to be successful. A well-organized student can focus on their studies and get more done less time.

Persistence: They don't give up when things get tough. They keep trying until they find a way to succeed. A constant student is always looking for ways to improve their skills and knowledge.

Responsibility: Take responsibility for their learning. They know that getting the work done is up to them, and they don't make excuses. A responsible student is always looking for ways to improve their skills and knowledge.

Self-discipline: They can stay focused on their work and resist distractions. A self-disciplined student is always looking for ways to improve their skills and knowledge.
