With a sense of the First Nations country upon which Good Counsel Primary is situated, where learning and ceremony have taken place over many thousands of years, we acknowledge the Mamu People and pay our respects to all Elders- past and present.

Dear Parents/Carers.

Well we have reached Week 10, the conclusion of a very busy Term 3. So many and varied learning experiences both inside and outside the classroom. Camps, excursions, guest visits, sporting activities and teaching moments.

Last week our students travelled to Radiant Life College for a cultural immersion day of learning. Senior students and staff from Radiant Life College, Goondoi Rangers staff and Mamu Elders organised a range of activities including-storytelling, rainforest walk, bush tucker tasting, damper making, spear throwing, dance and art work. The constant showers on the day could not dampen the students' excitement. Many thanks to Nathaniel Edwards (Principal of Radiant Life College) and staff, Pastor Manni Edwards and the Goondoi Rangers for their organisation of the day. On Friday, our First Nations students presented the NAIDOC Assembly which focused on respect for Elders and all cultures and races of peoples living together in harmony.

This week our piece of local artwork will be completed by Toshandai Fejo. She was back on site today adding the final touches to a beautiful depiction of our school, the Johnstone River and the coast line at Coquette Point with our local water creatures. Once complete, the artwork will be displayed in the stairwell leading from the Administration area to the Library. Last week, so many of our students conversed with Toshandai as she brought the painting to life from a blank canvas to the now finished product.

Supervision after school

We have had several incidents in the afternoon of students not turning up to correct pick up points and parents and staff searching for lost children. In most of these incidents students were playing on the oval or handball after school. As of Term 4, there will

be no handball straight after the bell at the end of the day. Our children have ample time to play before school, and at first and second breaks. Students who are waiting for parents/ carers or older siblings from GCC are to sit and wait in the Blue Area. At present we have students playing in multiple areas undercover and on the oval unsupervised by school staff and this raises a raft of duty care issues. Next term there will be several after school activities being run by Mrs Russell and AFL Cairns here at school, so sign up if you are interested.
