Late last week our Diocese received the news we have been waiting for, a new Bishop. We welcome Bishop Elect-Joe Caddy. Reverend Father Joe was ordained into the Priesthood in the Archdiocese of Melbourne in 1990 and is currently the Vicar General for the Archdiocese. Bishop Elect Joe will be the eighth Bishop of Cairns following the retirement of Bishop James Foley in August 2022, having served the role since July 1992. We sincerely thank Fr Kerry Crowley, our Parish Priest who has stood in the role of Diocesan Administrator for the past two years, juggling many 'Bishop' duties and the local needs of our churches and schools. As is tradition, we will have an opportunity to meet our new Bishop after his ordination later this year.
