



With a sense of the First Nations country upon which Good Counsel Primary is situated, where learning and ceremony have taken place over many thousands of years, we acknowledge the Mamu People and pay our respects to all Elders—past and present.

Dear Parents/Carers,

Last Thursday evening, I attended the farewell mass for our Executive Director of Catholic Education Services, Mr Bill Dixon. The service was celebrated by our new Bishop, Joe Caddy, with many dignitaries, staff, students and Bill's family attending. Bill has had an association with the Cairns Diocese for well over 20 years and the past 10 as our Executive Officer. During his time as Director he has focused on ensuring funds are spent on students to provide a world class education, upskilling staff, providing clear guidelines around compliance, and leading the way in First Nations Education. His work over the last decade has placed our schools and the education of our students in a great position. We wish him all happiness as he transitions to retirement at the end of the 2024 school year. Well deserved!

Mr Diarmuid O'Riordan has been appointed as Mr Bill Dixon's replacement. Diarmud has been a principal in several schools across Australia and more recently, Deputy Director of Brisbane Catholic Education. He worked in Cairns as an Area Supervisor for Secondary Education from 2010—2012 before returning to Brisbane. Mr O'Riordan begins his tenure in January 2025.

Over the past two Fridays, Year 3, 4 & 6 students have completed their Water Safety lessons. Overwhelmingly positive comments from the students and staff on how well students progressed at the pool with regard to their confidence and water safety. We do encourage parents/carers to book in your child to do more work in this area if they are a non-swimmer. We live in an area surrounded by creeks, rivers and the ocean and all students need to know how to swim. This week Year 5 and 1 start their sessions, and in Weeks 5-6, Year 2 and Preps will attend.

Our Year 4 students participate in their excursion to Ravenshoe/Herberton this Thursday. Most of the day is spent at the Herberton Historic Village where we all step back in time to learn about the past. With over 60 original buildings rebuilt to their former glory, the information boards explain the use of the items on display. It is a great day of learning. The students are always amazed.

Yesterday, the Socktober challenge commenced at the breaks, with the Yr 2s kicking off, followed by the Yr 6s. Two representatives from each class will be joined by all the other class representatives to be in Friday's GCPS Socktober Challenge. Remember to wear your crazy socks for this gold coin donation day, as we raise money for the children of Mongolia.



Congratulations to Ruby Torrisi and Rick Stephenson who represented the Peninsula Region at the State Track and Field in Brisbane last week. Ruby received gold in the shot put and silver in discus.
