

We are now entering Week 5 of term. At present our school is sitting at 74% attendance with less than 1.2% unexplained. It is very important for children to attend school each and every day (if they are of good health). 'Going to school' becomes a familiar pattern in a child's life and students can fall into a pattern of not attending very easily.

For the overwhelming majority of our students. homework is completed each week. Well done! We realise that in the lower years parents/carers organise their children and take the time to get homework completed and as students move into the upper school they take on (or should) being proactive in getting it completed. The benefit of homework is a much debated topic but it does teach students skills that they will carry throughout their academic and professional life, from time management and organisation, to self-motivation and autonomous learning. Learning at home also encourages good research habits while encouraging children to take ownership of their tasks.

Homework also helps to reinforce classroom learning and helps parents track what your child is learning at school. Working with your child can also alert you to difficulties they may have in a particular area of the curriculum which can be discussed with the teacher.

Parents who take the time to support their children with homework will assist their academic performance, develop better social skills, behaviour and self confidence and ultimately keep them out of BTO.

The recommended homework per day should be less than 30 minutes—15 minutes reading and 15 minute set work. If you are spending more time that this, please discuss with your class teacher about some modifications.
