ith a sense of the First Nations country upon which Good Counsel Primary is situated, where learning and ceremony have taken place over many thousands of years,
we acknowledge the Mamu People and pay our respects to all Elders—past and present.

Dear Parents/Carers,

At GCP we celebrate and recognise NAIDOC Week 2025 this week. NAIDOC Week across Australia is celebrated during the mid year school break. This year was the 50 year anniversary of NAIDOC celebrations. The theme for 2025 is "The Next Generation': Strength, Vision & Legacy." This theme celebrates the enduring spirit of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, focusing on the wisdom passed down through generations, the growing leadership of young people, and the importance of carrying stories and culture forward into the future.

The next generation—a call to uplift, invest in, and listen to the young people who are the future leaders and custodians of culture.

Strength—acknowledges the resilience and vitality of indigenous cultures and the strength of communities and individuals.

Vision—encourages looking forward with hope and determination, envisioning a future built on justice, equality and a thriving community for all.

Legacy—honours the ancestors, their stories, achievements and the knowledge they passed down to pave the way for future generations.



Classes this week will have an opportunity to participate in many and varied craft activities to celebrate NAIDOC Week. Our First Nations students who wish to be involved will lead our Friday prayer assembly at GCP. Our hope is that our First Nations students, and all students, experience an inspiring and engaging education so they can work together as our future leaders.

National Child Protection Week is from 7—13 September, but actually it should run all year, as our duty is to keep all children and young people safe. The theme this year "Every Conversation Matters: Shifting Conversation"

to Action". It highlights that while open discussions are crucial, words alone are not enough. As a school and wider community, we have role in protecting children. At school, our Student Protection contacts are Miss Carmel, Counsellor,

Mrs 'C' (APA/APRE), and myself as Principal. However, all staff members have been trained specifically each year in how to 'report' as it is a legal requirement of schools to do so. Remember, "Protecting children is everyone's business".



Last Wednesday, 4 of our students competed at the "All Abilities Day" at Barlow Park. It is a wonderful event organised by Peninsula School Sport with the assistance of approximately 20 FNQ sporting associations. It gave students an opportunity to experience and participate in non-competitive (apparently) sports including lawn bowls, athletics, cricket, netball, touch etc. What a day for our students to join 200 other students from over 30 schools in the region. 
