We have three very busy weeks remaining of the school year. As I reflect, it only seems like yesterday we were welcoming new faces at the beginning of 2025. Students over the next two weeks will be completing assessment items and revising work from the curriculum, as having a nine week term does compact the teaching time available.

In most years we would be announcing our teaching staff this week, however 2026 will be an extraordinary one for us, as we have five teachers who will be on maternity leave at some time in Semester 1.
